ANZI Pacific Forum 2021 Theme: 'Tropical Kindness - Reef Rainforest Outback'

The FNQ Outback: full of historic mining towns

Whilst the words Tropical Far North Queensland immediately brings to mind the Great Barrier Reef and lush green rainforest, the Far Northern Outback is only a couple of hours away!

First stop is the little town of Herberton, just over an hour and a half from Cairns, past Atherton. This historic town was a bustling mining town in its day and much of

that heritage is still visible. Visit the Mining Museum, Spy & Camera Museum and then spend a day at the Herberton Historic Village. Set on 16 acres, the Village contains 50 restored period buildings, including chemist, butcher, schoolhouse, garage (with some beautifully renovated vehicles), working blacksmith, printing shop and much more.

Less than half an hour from Herberton is Irvinebank, the tin mining town that refused to die! Established in 1882 it boasts many century old buildings, including the Loudoun House Museum, the oldest high-set timber and corrugated iron house in North Queensland, which is filled with memorabilia of the tin-mining days of the area. A courthouse and cellblock, the 1901 School of Arts Hall, Tramway Station, the Queensland National Bank Building, Mango Cottage and the 1907 Post Office building all attest to the architecture of prosperity at the turn of the last century.

The dry country: the power of nature at its most spectacular

Just under two and a half hours and 153 kms from Cairns is the little town of Innot Hot Springs.

The town was established around three hot mineral springs in Nettle Creek nearby. The surface temperature of the mineral rich water is around $71^{\circ}C$.

According to the Mamu people, the springs were created in the Dreamtime, when a large maritime turtle had a hot stone put in her stomach. She moved from the sea to this creek to warm the waters. From that day all large turtles stayed in the sea, while small tortoises would be permitted to live in freshwater rivers.

Just short of three hours from Cairns and 140kms west of Mareeba, along the Wheelbarrow Way, Chillagoe was once an ancient coral reef which has been transformed into spectacular limestone bluffs, with a network of some 560 caves, while early volcanic activity has created rich marble and mineral deposits. No longer mined, Chillagoe marble is famous for its soft pink colour.

Four hours from Cairns via Atherton, is Undara, one of the true wonders of Australia and home of the longest lava tubes in the world. Created by 23 billion cubic metres of molten lava spewed from volcanic activity almost 200,000 years ago, the longest of the Undara Lava Tubes is 160kms in length!

Guided tours include bushwalks through the tropical savannah countryside, conducted tours of the caves, guided night-time inspections of the wildlife that lives in the caves and helicopter flights to see the many dark scars across the landscape created by the lava flows.
